HISTORY MAKING MILESTONES of 2017



Through our partnership with Prudential Assurance Malaysia Berhad (PAMB) to raise awareness on financial education among Malaysian children, PAMB won the "Best Financial Education & Awareness" award by Bank Negara Malaysia.

To scale up Duit Right, we launch an Activator pilot project enabling just 16 people to deliver financial education to 3,279 secondary school students in a short span of 2 months - setting a new record!



In addition to daily breakfast. children from low-income families at SK Pujut in Miri, Sarawak now begin receiving brand-new school uniforms, shoes and bags so that they can attend school with dignity and confidence.



Thanks to our partners, Microsoft Malaysia and PAMB, we travel to Kota Kinabalu, Sabah to impact the lives of youth-at-risk at a new approved school (Sekolah Tunas Bakti), equipping them with financial education, computer literacy, character building & leadership skills.



We challenge university students at UCSI's Humanitarian Conference to develop solutions as we address the topic of Education in Poverty Eradication while our founder, Daniel Tan, receives their Top 10 Most Empowering Young Community Champions 2017 Award.



We reach our goal of providing 40,000 low-income families access to free financial protection across 21 communities in 5 states through PRUkasih, in partnership with PAMB.





We travel to SMK Marudi in Baram, Sarawak for the 1st time to equip 172 students with financial education, computer literacy and Cyber Wellness values.

A new partnership with KL - Kepong Industrial Holding Sdn. Bhd. (KLK) enables us to help Orang Asli children from a new community, Desa Temuan, improve their English literacy through our Community Reading Program (CRP).



Together with our partner Vision Space Optometrist and Hoya Lenses, we run vision checks for over 400 under-served students in 10 schools across the Klang Valley to ensure that they are able see what is taught in class and provide spectacles for those in need.

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Beneficiaries : **GG Education Fund Cohort**

In 2016, we began an Education Fund to help under-served students gain access to tertiary education. It was birthed out of seeing students from low-income communities missing tertiary education not because they didn't want to study, but because they simply couldn't afford to.

In 2017, thanks to the continued support of **Newfields Advisors Sdn. Bhd.** and **public donors**, we were able to grant 4 new deserving students this opportunity bringing our total cohort to 6.

Committed and diligent, they may not have begun as straight-A students, but many have scored better grades after being given the opportunity to further their studies. This opportunity doesn't come easy to them but our collective belief and confidence has inspired them to persevere and transform their lives through education.

They have grown into individuals with strong leadership skills & character, many contributing in their unique capacities back to their community.



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Partnership: Duit Right & The Activator Model

We believe in raising a next generation of Malaysians that are financially savvy and resilient from young. We are able to do that through Cha-Ching and Duit Right—one of which was a program created in partnership with Prudential Assurance Malaysia Berhad (PAMB), equipping Malaysian children, youth and adults with fundamental values and knowledge to make better financial decisions that will ultimately improve their lives.

To date, we've equipped over 48,830 children, youth and adults with fundamental financial education in 271 schools, government institutions and low-income communities across 11 different states in Malaysia including Penang, Terengganu, Malacca, Negeri Sembilan, Johor, and Sabah.

2017 marked several meaningful milestones: Duit Right being recognized nationally by Bank Negara Malaysia for 'Best Financial Education & Awareness' and recognized regionally by Bett Asia for 'Best Collaboration', excellence and innovation in the education industry, thanks to the birth of the Activator Model.

The Duit Right Activator Model enabled us to impact nearly 5,633 school students out of the total 11,000 in 2017. It trained university students to run the program almost independently in secondary schools and served a triple-win: enabling us to scale-up in a short span of time while providing professional exposure opportunities for university students and inspiring higher engagement from the secondary school participants who could connect better with university student trainers.

Volunteer: You're Never Too Young to Start

For Nicol, volunteering has been a part of her life since she was 12. Seeing her older brother Nicholas volunteer for Pusat Bimbingan Pelajar (PBP), an academic guidance program in GG, made her realise that age is no barrier.

"When I started volunteering, I was a 12-year-old teaching another 13-year-old mathematics. It built my confidence and made me realise how I could help others with what I know."

As one of our youngest volunteers then, she's an example that you can never be too young to start serving others. That stirred a passion within her to serve in other programs – whenever the need arose. Nicol was awarded GG's Platinum Award recognising outstanding hours of service totaling of 254 hours in 2017. That's equivalent to 8 hours of work over 32 days!

Her volunteer experience inspired her to start Project Heart to raise funds for the Austism Café Project and to empower autistic children. She has also gone on to do more mini projects with her friends to help others, like her recent project for Challenge Week: a self-initiated, self-directed, and self-funded service project to work with students from SMK Bario, Sarawak.

Super **SARAPAN**

Super Sarapan (SS) feeds children from low-income families a meal daily for an entire school year with the aim of reducing their parents' financial burden, enabling children to concentrate better in class and have added motivation to attend school.

Thanks to the generosity of **CIMB Foundation**. **NextGen Group** and individual donors we were able to feed 700 children from low-income families Super Sarapan across 17 schools in the Klang Valley and Sarawak for an entire year; 300 more than the previous year.

Through our survey, 94% of students were satisfied with the program and 80% reported that it helped to reduce their hunger during school days. School principals and counsellors report improved attendance, behavior, and academic achievement of their students.





UniformPackages

Children from low-income families can only afford one school uniform to last them several years.

They opt to skip school when their uniforms don't dry in time affecting their school attendance and performance.

Thanks to the generosity of **Dunnhumby**, Mah Sing Foundation, KLK Oleo, staff of Shell Malaysia and individual donors, we were able to provide uniform packages (comprising of 2 sets of brand new uniforms, 1 pair of school shoes & socks, and 1 school bag) to over 400 under-served children so that they can go to school with confidence & dignity.

FAMILY SUPPORT

90% of low-income families wouldn't be able to withstand financial shocks of unemployment, physical impairment, death, divorce or changes in living costs. 80% wouldn't be able to survive beyond a month if their incomes were cut off because more than 50% don't have any savings*.

These families are sustained hand-to-mouth by one breadwinner who usually works long-hours in a low-paying job.

Whenever unfortunate circumstances arise, the children's access to education is affected – because they cannot afford food, housing or even transportation to go to school.

We help low-income families build resilience so that their collective well-being continues to improve, their basic needs are met and their children have proper access to education.

One of the key ways is through financial protection. To date, our partnership with **Prudential Assurance Malaysia Berhad (PAMB)** has enabled us to provide 40, 000 low-income families access to **PRU**kasih, a free financial protection plan, across 21 communities in 5 states. Through **PRU**kasih, we've been able to help 961 families recover from the financial shock of illness, injury or death while having food on the table, a roof over their heads and continued access to school.

We also help individual families overcome unique challenges that come with poverty.

A newly-widowed mother of two young children in our community was robbed of all her home necessities while still grieving the loss of her husband. She also faced a debt close to RM 1,500 due to stolen and illegal usage of electricity from her home by other residents.

Through our GG Financial Aid (GGFA) for families in need, we were able to ensure that all her family's basic needs were met. We installed a new fridge and restored her home with donated furniture. With the fridge she was able to sell kuih in her community and generate income. Upon discovering that she used to sew, we repaired her sewing machine so that she can continue to care for her young children while working from home. She is now able to sustain her family's livelihood.

Basic **EDUCATION**

Our goal is to help under-served children achieve minimum standards in literacy and numeracy so that they can thrive within our local education system. We also provide funding support to further their tertiary education.

Our impact is measured in 3A's: Attendance, Academic Attainment and Attitude with the following goals for 2017:



•65% student attendance every session.



• A minimum maintenance of students' grades in PBP assessments, while monitoring their school examination results.



our academic guidance and mentorship program, was able to impact 32 Primary and 49 Secondary students thanks to the generosity of **Mah Sing Foundation**, individual donors and 27 dedicated volunteers.





PRIMARY STUDENTS

We achieved an average of 60% attendance in more than half of our primary students. Approximately 41% have either retained their grade or increased their grades in both English and Mathematics.

Students have grown in confidence and commitment, often arriving to sessions early to help their mentors to set-up.

SECONDARY STUDENTS

We achieved an average of 70% attendance from secondary students, indicating their commitment towards the program. Approximately 84% and 57% of them have either retained their grade or increased their grades in English and Mathematics respectively.

They remain hardworking and committed towards progressing in their subjects. 17 of our PBP students also served as Junior Mentors to coach younger students in our other education programs.

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OUR COMMUNITY READING PROGRAM (CRP),

was able help 45 children from Taman Prima Selayang and 30 children from PPR Taman Putra Damai improve their English literacy through reading thanks to the on-going support of Chek Hup Sdn Bhd and 51 dedicated volunteers.

We achieved high attendance rates of children; 69% in Taman Prima Selayang and 83% in Taman Putra Damai respectively, indicating high commitment and interest in our program.

We also achieved vast improvement in the reading levels of the children; 93% in Taman Prima Selayang and 89% in Taman Putra Damai respectively have either increased their reading level by at least one level or retained it. This indicates that the majority of children are improving in their English comprehension and reading abilities.







To accommodate the growing demand and popularity of CRP in the community, we expanded to two locations at Taman Prima Selayang and moved to a larger location at PPR Taman Putra Damai.

The children's ownership over the program is highly encouraging – they arrive early at sessions to help our volunteers set up and commit to attend despite bad weather conditions and lift malfunctions.

CRP is also drawing positive reception from the children's parents whose word-of-mouth recommendations have contributed to increase in new attendees.

They also attest to how their children have benefited, enjoyed themselves and improved in their attitudes.









Thanks to **KL-Kepong Industrial Holding Sdn. Bhd. (KLK)** we were able to expand to provide CRP for a new community – helping 11 Orang Asli youth from Desa Temuan increase their English literacy. This is a high-need community because many youth end up dropping out of Secondary school due to poor English literacy and inability to catch up at school.

Despite it being a new community, we maintained a 70% attendance rate indicating the students' commitment and motivation to learn.



80% and 78% of these youth improved in their English grammar and reading respectively. We were also able to provide our students with brand new uniform packages as added motivation to continue to attend school with confidence.

CRP has proven to be a relevant program in low-income communities and will continue to maintain a conducive learning environments for more children to access quality English learning material.

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Growth of **JUNIOR MENTORS**

Beyond academics, GG is passionate about raising an exemplary next generation of leaders – beneficiaries that are empowered to be positive contributors in their own community. We see that in our Junior Mentors—PBP students that regularly coach younger students and work to raise awareness of our programs in their community.

They've grown in their leadership and personal enrichment through unique exposure opportunities. They were given the opportunity to learn principles of success in the workplace from a meeting with Mah Sing Group Berhad's CEO, Datuk Ho and his employees. They were inspired from the visit to dream bigger dreams and were motivated to excel in their studies.

They were also given the opportunity to conceptualise, direct and act out a stage performance in English during GG's Thanksgiving dinner for over 100 guests consisting of corporate partners, government agency representatives, volunteers and donors.

Their performance, which ended with a closing speech by one of our students explaining in his own words why education has the power to transform the lives of the under-served, drew a standing ovation from guests. Many of our Junior Mentors received our annual volunteer award for outstanding hours of service in our programs.

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Making 21st Century **SKILLS ACCESSIBLE TO YOUTH-AT-RISK**

Thanks to the support of **Microsoft Malaysia** and **Prudential Assurance Malaysia Berhad (PAMB)**, were able to reach 172 students in SMK Marudi, Baram Sarawak and 189 youth-at-risk in 3 approved schools ('Sekolah Tunas Bakti') across Malaysia. To date our partnership has enabled us to impact the lives of 534 youth in 6 out of 8 STBs nationwide.

These children and youth have little or no access to quality learning and enrichment opportunities. They were equipped with cyber wellness values, leadership skills, financial education, and computer literacy to help them be more resilient to challenges in life and give them hope to continue their studies.

In June of the same year, with the support of the Department of Social Welfare (JKM), individual donors, and volunteers; we had the privilege of impacting the lives of at-risk teenage girls through GLOW at a protection home, Taman Seri Puteri. GLOW is a program that mentors participants to grow into confident young women with a sense of self-worth, identity and purpose.

We were able to encourage these teenage girls with simple truths in their most challenging times, reminding them that they have hope and a future. After completing the program, many of them shared that they have renewed strength to persevere through challenges, continue their studies and achieve their dreams.



CIMB Foundation & NextGen Group has provided 170 children in 4 schools with a meal in school every day under the Super Sarapan Program. The children really appreciate the meal provided and also recorded an average attendance of 65%-95% throughout the program.





Vision Space Optometrist & Malaysian Hoya Lens provided 100 over children in-need a new pair of spectacles made from donated pre-loved frames & new lenses. This gift of sight has given those in need a clearer vision for their future.







Through our 5-year partnership with **Prudential Assurance Malaysia Berhad (PAMB)**, 40,000 households now have access to financial protection through PRUkasih, 15,573 children & youth have received financial education through Cha-Ching & Duit Right.

Newfields has provided funds to enable 2 existing and 3 new youth from the community to pursue tertiary education in 2017. In addition, Newfields also funded a RISE leadership camp that instilled good character and values in 64 prefects who were inspired to be a positive influence in their school.

Mah Sing Foundation funded the Program Bimbingan Pelajar (PBP) Secondary, where 49 youth benefitted from the program. 63-83% attend the program weekly, 57-84% improved in their academics and now carry a positive attitude.

GG is registered with the Companies Commission of Malaysia (Co No. 1121213-V) under the Companies Act 1965.

GG is also a GST registered organisation with the Royal Malaysian Customs Department (GST registration no. 000330616832) under the Goods and Services Tax Act 2014.



An annual audit is obtained in accordance with approved standards on auditing in Malaysia by an independent public accounting firm, Baker Tilly Monteiro Heng (Audit Firm No: AF 0117). The financial statements of Yayasan Generasi Gemilang were audited and found to give a true and fair view of the financial position of the Yayasan as at 31 December 2017, and of its financial performance and cash flows for the financial year then ended in accordance with Malaysian Financial Reporting Standards, International Financial Reporting Standards and the requirements of the Companies Act 1965 in Malaysia. 

INCOME



INCOME

DONATIONS are funds donated to support GG's mission and programs in compliance with our Giving Policy (guidelines available on our website). Donations consist of general and restricted donations received from individuals and from non-government entities including corporate bodies and non-profit organisations. Restricted donations are recognised when the specific utilisation conditions have been met.

Donations have increased by 16% to RM3,503,888 (2016: RM3,025,563) largely due to the increase in donations received from corporate partners. There were more corporate partnerships established in 2017 as well as growth in existing long-term partnerships. The corporate partners that have made it possible for us to achieve this growth during the year are featured on page 39 to 44 of this annual report.


PROGRAM CONTRIBUTIONS are received with regards to programs and workshops conducted for schools, organisations and communities.

Program contributions have decreased slightly by 7% to RM326,892 compared to the previous year (2016: RM350,397) due to the discontinuation of one of our programs.

OTHER OPERATING INCOME includes interest income from placement of fixed deposits with licensed banks and income from disposal of office equipment.

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SPENDING by **FUNCTIONS**



Expenditure on Charitable Activities includes program staff costs and program material costs. Spending has increased by 21% to RM3.21m compared to 2016 (2016: RM2.65m). This growth is attributed to the increase in the number of beneficiaries served. Furthermore, in line with the increase in grant funding, we were able to expand the scope of our services to equip our beneficiaries with more life skills elements and enrich their learning experiences.

A further breakdown of charitable activities are as follows:

Expenditure on Stakeholder Relations Management covers program staff costs and expenses incurred for communications and building stakeholder relationships. We have maintained this consistent to 2016 at 5% of total spending.

Operating Expenses covers operational staff costs, premises and administrative expenses. In 2017, operating costs was reduced to 12% of our total expenditure at RM469,883 (2016: 17% of total expenditure at RM577,672).
